Lighting the Advent Wreath -- Advent 2: Hope

Reader 1: Today we light the second candle on our Advent wreath and look ahead in hope for the coming of the Reign of God.

Two purple candles are lit

Reader 2: A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots. The wolf shall live with the lamb, the leopard shall lie down with the kid, the calf and the lion and the fatling together, and a little child shall lead them.

Reader 1: We pray for those for whom hope feels distant and faint, especially prisoners, the sick, those who are far from home, and those who have no homes to return to. We pray for those whose hope has failed, especially those who are having suicidal thoughts, those who have died by suicide, and their families.

People: Gracious God, you have promised us that suffering produces endurance, endurance produces character, character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us. Pour your love into our hearts, that we may bring hope to those who have no hope, through the power of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The people standing, the Celebrant says

Blessed be God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

People And blessed be God's reign, now and for ever. Amen.

The Celebrant may say

Almighty God, to you all hearts are open, all desires known, and from you no secrets are hid: Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy Name; through Christ our Lord. *Amen*.

⁷Welcome one another, therefore, just as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God. ⁸For I tell you that Christ has become a servant of the circumcised on behalf of the truth of God in order that he might confirm the promises given to the patriarchs, ⁹and in order that the Gentiles might glorify God for his mercy. the one who rises to rule the Gentiles:


