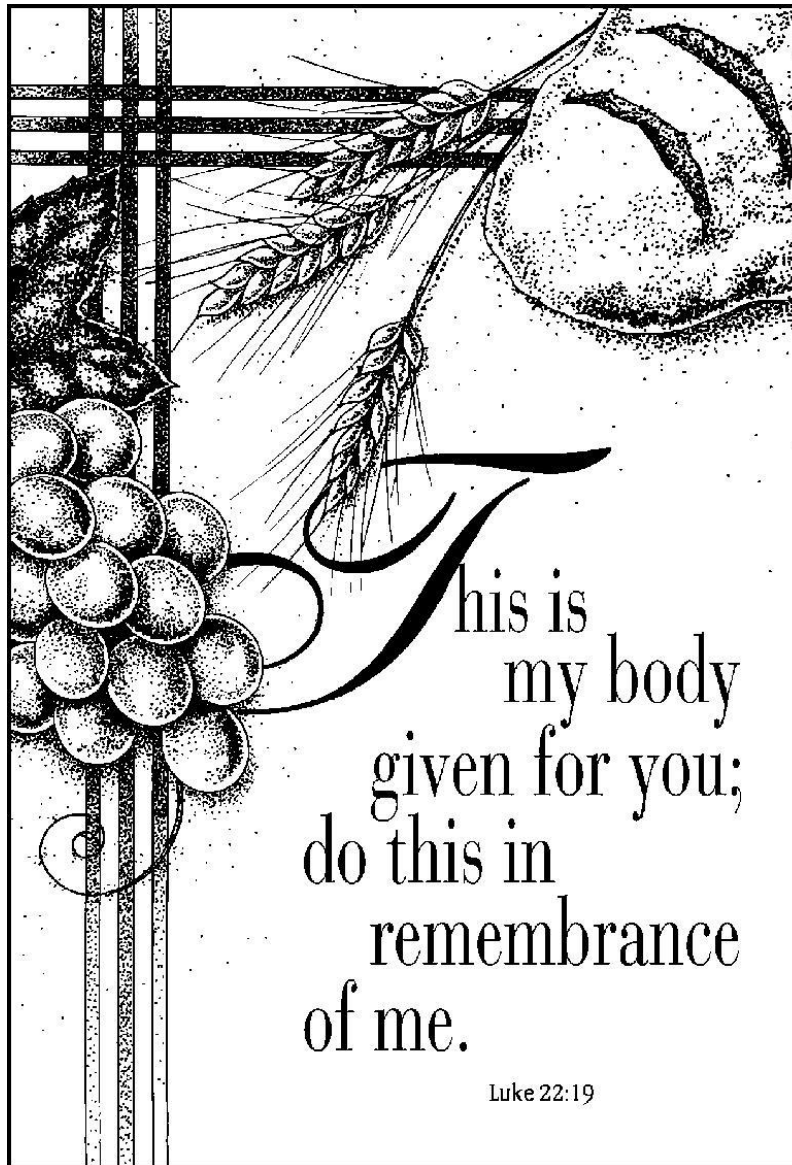

Celebrant The Lord be with you.

Celebrant Let us pray.

Almighty Father, whose dear Son, on the night before he suffered, instituted the Sacrament of his Body and Blood: Mercifully grant that we may receive it thankfully in remembrance of Jesus Christ our Lord, who in these holy mysteries gives us a pledge of eternal life; and who now lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen.*

The Lessons

FIRST READING: Exodus 12:1-4 [5-10] 11-14

The people sit.

A Reading from the book of Exodus.

¹The LORD said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt: ²This month shall mark for you the beginning of months; it shall be the first month of the year for you. ³Tell the whole congregation of Israel that on the tenth of this month they are to take a lamb for each family, a lamb for each household. ⁴If a household is too small for a whole lamb, it shall join its closest neighbor in obtaining one; the lamb shall be divided in proportion to the number of people who eat of it. [⁵Your lamb shall be without blemish, a year-old male; you may take it from the sheep or from the goats. ⁶You shall keep it until the fourteenth day of this month; then the whole assembled congregation of Israel shall slaughter it at twilight. ⁷They shall take some of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and the lintel of the houses in which they eat it. ⁸They shall eat the lamb that same night; they shall eat it roasted over the fire with unleavened bread and bitter herbs. ⁹Do not eat any of it raw or boiled in water, but roasted over the fire, with its head, legs, and inner organs. ¹⁰You shall let none of it remain until the morning; anything that remains until the morning you shall burn.] ¹¹This is how you shall eat it: your loins girded, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand; and you shall eat it hurriedly. It is the passover of the LORD. ¹²For I will pass through the land of Egypt that night, and I will strike down every firstborn in the

land of Egypt, both human beings and animals; on all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgments: I am the LORD. ¹³The blood shall be a sign for you on the houses where you live: when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and no plague shall destroy you when I strike the land of Egypt.

¹⁴This day shall be a day of remembrance for you. You shall celebrate it as a festival to the LORD; throughout your generations you shall observe it as a perpetual ordinance.

Reader The Word of the Lord.
People Thanks be to God.

Silence may follow.

PSALM: Psalm 116:1, 10-17

Remain seated.

¹I love the LORD, because he has heard the voice of my supplication, *
because he has inclined his ear to me whenever I called upon him.

¹⁰How shall I repay the LORD *
for all the good things he has done for me?

¹¹I will lift up the cup of salvation *
and call upon the Name of the LORD.

¹²I will fulfill my vows to the LORD *
in the presence of all his people.

¹³Precious in the sight of the LORD *
is the death of his servants.

¹⁴O LORD, I am your servant; *
**I am your servant and the child of your handmaid;
you have freed me from my bonds.**

¹⁵I will offer you the sacrifice of thanksgiving *
and call upon the Name of the LORD.

¹⁶I will fulfill my vows to the LORD *
in the presence of all his people,

¹⁷in the courts of the LORD's house, *
**in the midst of you, O Jerusalem.
Hallelujah!**

SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 11:23-26

The people sit.

A Reading from Paul's First letter to the Church in Corinth.

²³I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took a loaf of bread, ²⁴and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." ²⁵In the same way he took the cup also,

after supper, saying, “This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.” ²⁶For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord’s death until he comes.

Reader The Word of the Lord.

People **Thanks be to God.**

Silence may follow.

SEQUENCE HYMN *Thou, who at thy first Eucharist didst pray (Song 1) (H 315)*

All stand.

GOSPEL: Luke 22:14-30

All stand.

Celebrant The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

People **Glory to you, Lord Christ.**

¹⁴ When the hour came, he took his place at the table, and the apostles with him. ¹⁵ He said to them, “I have eagerly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer, ¹⁶ for I tell you, I will not eat it^[a] until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God.” ¹⁷ Then he took a cup, and after giving thanks he said, “Take this and divide it among yourselves, ¹⁸ for I tell you that from now on I will not drink of the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes.” ¹⁹ Then he took a loaf of bread, and when he had given thanks he broke it and gave it to them, saying, “This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.” ²⁰ And he did the same with the cup after supper, saying, “This cup that is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood.^[b] ²¹ But see, the one who betrays me is with me, and his hand is on the table. ²² For the Son of Man is going as it has been determined, but woe to that one by whom he is betrayed!” ²³ Then they began to ask one another which one of them it could be who would do this.

²⁴ A dispute also arose among them as to which one of them was to be regarded as the greatest. ²⁵ But he said to them, “The kings of the gentiles lord it over them, and those in authority over them are called benefactors. ²⁶ But not so with you; rather, the greatest among you must become like the youngest and the leader like one who serves. ²⁷ For who is greater, the one who is at the table or the one who serves? Is it not the one at the table? But I am among you as one who serves.

²⁸ “You are those who have stood by me in my trials, ²⁹ and I confer on you, just as my Father has conferred on me, a kingdom, ³⁰ so that you may eat and drink at my table in my kingdom, and you will sit on thrones judging the twelve tribes of Israel.

Celebrant The Gospel of the Lord.

People **Praise to you, Lord Christ.**

Celebrant: And so, Father, we who have been redeemed by him, and
made a new people by water and the Spirit, now bring before
you these gifts. Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be the
Body and Blood of Jesus Christ our Lord.

At the following words concerning the bread, the Celebrant is to hold it,
or lay a hand upon it, and at the words concerning the cup, to hold or
place a hand upon the cup and any other vessel containing wine to be
consecrated.

On the night he was betrayed he took bread, said the
blessing, broke the bread, and gave it to his friends, and
said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do
this for the remembrance of me."

After supper, he took the cup of wine, gave thanks, and
said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new
Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the
forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the
remembrance of me."

Remembering now his work of redemption, and offering to you this
sacrifice of thanksgiving,
We celebrate his death and resurrection,

as we await the day of his coming.

Lord God of our Fathers: God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob; God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ: Open our eyes to see your hand at work in the world about us. Deliver us from the presumption of coming to this Table for solace only, and not for strength; for pardon only, and not for renewal. Let the grace of this Holy Communion make us one body, one spirit in Christ, that we may worthily serve the world in his name.

Risen Lord, be known to us in the breaking of the Bread.

The Stripping of the Altar.
During the Stripping of the Altar, Psalm 22 is recite by all

Psalm 22

- 1 *My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? *
and are so far from my cry
and from the words of my distress?*
- 2 *O my God, I cry in the daytime, but you do not answer; *
by night as well, but I find no rest.*
- 3 *Yet you are the Holy One, *
enthroned upon the praises of Israel.*
- 4 *Our forefathers put their trust in you; *
they trusted, and you delivered them.*
- 5 *They cried out to you and were delivered; *
they trusted in you and were not put to shame.*
- 6 *But as for me, I am a worm and no man, *
scorned by all and despised by the people.*
- 7 *All who see me laugh me to scorn; *
they curl their lips and wag their heads, saying,*
- 8 *"He trusted in the LORD; let him deliver him; *
let him rescue him, if he delights in him."*
- 9 *Yet you are he who took me out of the womb, *
and kept me safe upon my mother's breast.*
- 10 *I have been entrusted to you ever since I was born; *
you were my God when I was still in my
mother's womb.*
- 11 *Be not far from me, for trouble is near, *
and there is none to help.*
- 12 *Many young bulls encircle me; *
strong bulls of Bashan surround me.*
- 13 *They open wide their jaws at me, *
like a ravening and a roaring lion.*

- 14 *I am poured out like water;
all my bones are out of joint; *
my heart within my breast is melting wax.*
- 15 *My mouth is dried out like a pot-sherd;
my tongue sticks to the roof of my mouth; *
and you have laid me in the dust of the grave.*
- 16 *Packs of dogs close me in,
and gangs of evildoers circle around me; *
they pierce my hands and my feet;
I can count all my bones.*
- 17 *They stare and gloat over me; *
they divide my garments among them;
they cast lots for my clothing.*
- 18 *Be not far away, O LORD; *
you are my strength; hasten to help me.*
- 19 *Save me from the sword, *
my life from the power of the dog.*
- 20 *Save me from the lion's mouth, *
my wretched body from the horns of wild bulls.*
- 21 *I will declare your Name to my brethren; *
in the midst of the congregation I will praise you.*
- 22 *Praise the LORD, you that fear him; *
stand in awe of him, O offspring of Israel;
all you of Jacob's line, give glory.*
- 23 *For he does not despise nor abhor the poor in their poverty;
neither does he hide his face from them; *
but when they cry to him he hears them.*
- 24 *My praise is of him in the great assembly; *
I will perform my vows in the presence of those who
worship him.*

25 *The poor shall eat and be satisfied,
and those who seek the LORD shall praise him: **
 "May your heart live for ever!"

26 *All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to
 the LORD, **
 and all the families of the nations bow before him.

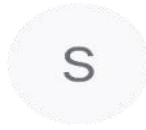
27 *For kingship belongs to the LORD; **

28 *To him alone all who sleep in the earth bow down
 in worship; **
 all who go down to the dust fall before him.

29 *My soul shall live for him;
